## 1/15/17 “We the People Against Hate March”

**1/18/17, Save Our Health Care vigil** at the offices of Republican Congressman Leonard Lance, NJ's 7th District, in Westfield (where I was) and Flemington. The rally was to urge/demand that Lance not support repeal of the ACA. Approximately 100 people showed up in Westfield (and the same number in Flemington). Congressman Lance came out to speak to us. The humor of the night was when he asked the crowd if they wanted tickets to the inauguration, and in unison, the crowd said, “NOOOOO.” He invited 20 participants to come into his office to speak to him for about 15 minutes. He came outside, again, after the meeting and said that his stance is that he will not vote to repeal unless there is another plan ready to go into effect, but the crowd demanded NO REPEAL.

The vigils will continue in Westfield (and perhaps, the other towns), every Wednesday, 4:30-7:00, at Congressman Lance's office. *Susan Gordan*
